



The Missing Piece Project

With thanks to Autism Speaks Canada the Autism Society Wood Buffalo was able to begin an Ambassador Program in 2017. We have been fortunate to sustain this program thanks to funding provided by The RMWB Community Investment Program. The program allows us to continue community office hours, a community ambassador and the expansion of the Missing Piece Project. The Ambassador is here to provide support and guidance with connecting individuals to programs, supports and information. As well as providing education and awareness to the community through public engagements, presentations and information.

- Present to your group on topics such as inclusion, introduction to autism, and general awareness.
- Help your organization or business create an awareness campaign
- Connect individuals to services and supports with in our region
- Advocate with families
- Provide information
- Connect with and create relationships with organizations in the community to assist them in creating inclusive programing

The Missing Pieces Program is a resource intended to promote and educate others about Autism Spectrum Disorder. It covers topics of understanding ASD, acceptance, how to assist and include others by understanding differences. Each contains activities designed to promote inclusion, understanding and acceptance and will be tailored to the specific user group.

The resource can be borrowed from the Autism Society office with training provided if required. A presentation by an autism ambassador is also available.

Intended audience for the program are for educational staff, Students (K-6 kits available), community groups and employers.

We are excited to soon be launching a video series titled One More Piece, as an extension of this initiative.
